DEVOTIONAL

We were led in prayer by our brother and member of this Assembly, Abel Ramírez.

Our president Luís Daniel Pérez shared a reflection of the Word of God.

In his introduction he welcomed all attendees.

Pastor Luis Daniel read from Isaiah 41:8-11. This passage caught my attention, and precisely because of the moment we are living. As humans, we feel certain weaknesses.

God knows us, and despite our weaknesses, He imparts strength to us. It is known that He knows us and knows where we come from; He called us and chose us without deserving to be chosen. I am encouraged by the thought of knowing that He takes us from the ends of the earth. He sees our hearts and calls us when others saw nothing special in us.

Verse 10 encourages us not to fear because He is with us and affirms that He is our God. This encourages us and strengthens us: Do not lose heart, I am your God who strengthens you. In difficult times, I will be there, I will always help you, I will never leave you. How good it is to find someone who expresses himself with words like that, with confidence, making us understand that he is our friend and that he will not leave us alone!

We must maintain our faithfulness before God, we must be always firm. In no way should we stop doing what he has entrusted to us. The world is under attack and in lot of pressure due to the Coronavirus. This assembly is virtual due to the danger of this virus. This 10th verse of Isaiah chapter 41 has helped me live my ministry life. My father since I was 10 taught me this verse. It is true that we have weaknesses, but his strength is with us.

Something interesting is in verse eleven: The threats will not go away, but our God will always be with us. Our God is strong, faithful and all powerful, who supports us when we allow it. I wanted to leave these words with you: In the world we will have affliction, but we can trust because we have the Almighty God who delivers us. He will give us the victory if we remain faithful to Him.

Brother Luís Daniel concluded the devotional with a few words of prayer, asking God to guide us throughout this process.

2. PRESENTATION OF THE AGENDA

The agenda was presented and approved as presented.

3. MINUTES READING OF THE ASSEMBLY 2019 – 2020

The secretary read the minutes of the previous year's Assembly. It was received and approved without modification.

4. PRESENTATION OF THE ANNUAL REPORT 2020 – 2021

Daniel Rodríguez, executive director, presented the report with the activities carried out during the year 2021-2022.

Below is a summary of the most important activities included in the report of the Executive Direction.

Estimated figures: new believers 13,109; baptized 4,606; strayed 2,082; created ministries of service to the community, 597; Natural Church Development networks,

28; churches in Natural Church Development, 217. Twenty-four of the networks were opened in our country and the remaining four in Guatemala.

As for the training workshops, we thank God who allowed us to carry out most of the scheduled activities. Some of them, such as the Holistic Vision and the Discipleship Workshop, had to be carried out in multiple deliveries to achieve the goals proposed in the annual plan and maintain the distancing rules established due to Covid-19. This is how we held five Holistic Vision Workshops, three in the Dominican Republic and two in Guatemala. The total attendance in our country was 56 pastors and 54 leaders, while in Guatemala 31 pastors and 35 leaders attended.

Regarding discipleship, we introduced a new motivational workshop to get more churches to join this initiative. At the end of the year, we had 264 Disciple makers and 519 disciples, for a total of 783. GRIP continues to contribute to AAVI and the country, with a total of 1,192 cases attended. In addition to his invaluable support in the Family Counseling workshops.

The director concluded with words of thanks to the brothers of Love Serves, for their commitment and hard work in favor of the kingdom of God; as well as the members of the Board of Directors and the other members of the Assembly. Daniel Ramírez proposed the report be accepted; Peter seconded and so we moved on to the presentation of the Audited Financial Report.

5. PRESENTATION OF THE AUDITED FINANCIAL REPORT, JULY 2020 – JUNE 2021

Laura Felipe assisted us with the presentation of the audited financial report.

Leonardo de la Rosa proposed both reports to be accepted, the executive director and the financial report. It was seconded by Mayra Pimentel, who thanked God because, despite the restrictions imposed by the pandemic, the Lord has not stopped his work. She praised God and congratulated the AAVI team for their hard work during this difficult and confusing reality that we have had to live. They were submitted for voting and was approved unanimously.

6. PRESENTATION OF THE ANNUAL WORK PLAN AND BUDGET 2021 – 2022

José Brito (Jochi) presented us the plan for the year.

Proposed Goals:

- 1. Sixty (60) churches forming part of networks for the Natural Church Development and the holistic Mission. Guiding their churches to discover their spiritual gifts (training to carry out ministries).
- 2. One hundred and sixty (160) pastors trained in how to multiply disciples and leading their churches in discipleship.
- 3. Eighty (80) people trained to develop thirty (30) new Family Counseling ministries.
- 4. Two hundred (200) churches trained in the prevention of teenage pregnancy through biblical resources.
- 5. Two hundred and forty (240) church leaders trained for teen ministry.
- 6. Two hundred (200) churches trained to set up Vacation Bible School.
- 7. Three hundred (300) motivated youth leaders to continue ministry with teenagers.
- 8. Three hundred (300) OANSA club leaders relaunched weekly work with children.
- 9. Three (03) prayer, meditation, and relaxation retreats for the members of the operational team.
- 10. An onboarding activity for AAVI servers and their spouses.

Domingo Méndez asked to speak: I would like to see that home gardens can be made, I offer myself as a volunteer to help with this initiative. I have experience in that area. expressed our brother.

Daniel Ramírez asked to speak: I think the approach is very good; It is a big job that is being considered, for example, working with pre-adolescents, premarital, etc.

To get the most out of it, we must provide training to help pastors in how to do planning in their church. I don't mean something complicated; It is something simple so that they can have a clear idea of what they will do in the year and how to follow up on a single page.

The pastor is like the manager of the church; You must have clear goals and how you will achieve them, but also a monitoring system that, on a quarterly basis, allows you to see how each department is doing. If we were to ask pastors about their plans and goals for the year, I'm sure very few would have that clearly defined.

Domingo Méndez supported the idea of Daniel Ramírez, on the need to instruct the churches in the elaboration of strategic planning.

Laura Felipe assisted us in presenting the budget for the year.

The work plan and the budget were put to a vote and were approved by the majority.

7. PARTICIPATION OF UNITED STATES PARTNERS

Peter Swanson shared a few words with us.

I really do have a family at Love Serves. I have heard your prayers for us and for my family; and I am very grateful. I apologize for not having a written report, I have been in recovery for the last few weeks.

God is doing great things in Florida and now in Boston as well. We have four groups: one Hispanic, two English-speaking, and one Portuguese. We have twenty-four active pastors in those four groups. In the last fourteen months, twelve ministries have been created in some of the churches that we are accompanying.

I want to share a testimony from two pastors: Pastor Jeff, who is my pastor, his church has a small group that has worked hard with leadership. A ministry with Chinese has been started in our building, ministries to treat addicts, a ministry with children who have been abused, and we have plans to work with the disabled. Pastor Jeff has shared that the reason the leadership has grown is related to the follow-up that has been given to the leadership. Another achievement has been the baptism of twenty people in the last twelve months.

The other testimony is from Pastor Bruce: Pastor of a small church with 25 members. What I want to share is how his heart has been transformed and affected the unity of the church. His church made contact with a mother and her three children: a family in great need. Pastor Bruce asked another pastor in his network to take on that mother with her children, since his church had a program for children and younger families; that would surely be of more support to this mother and her children. What struck me about this action was that Pastor Bruce was more focused on the need of this family than on the growth of his own church.

These are just two of many testimonials and they give me hope that the paradigm can change in the United States.

I want to thank God for the life of Brother Nidio, there are many hours that he invests in us (Wallace and me). Thank you Nidio and all of you for praying for us.

Words from Wallace Costa: "I want to greet Luís Daniel, Daniel Rodríguez, and the entire Board in the Dominican Republic. For me it is a great pleasure to be able to participate with this team that has helped me a lot, that has helped me grow in the knowledge of the Word of God. The book of Mark, especially chapter two, speaks deeply to my heart. It is a passage that tells a story of four friends who decided to bring a paralyzed man to Jesus; they had several obstacles to overcome to elevate

the man to Jesus. When they finally got him down to where Jesus was, the text says that Jesus saw the faith of the four friends, healed the paralyzed man, and forgave his sins. For me, the idea of faith as an action is fundamental in the Bible; Putting your faith in Jesus is a very practical thing."

"I am delighted with the opportunity to help churches here in the United States, both English-speaking and Portuguese-speaking; so that they become healthy churches, that they make disciples and that they are a relevant church in their communities. Thank you very much for the opportunity you give me to work with you.

As Peter informed you, in the month of July I started a job with nine pastors in the city of Boston; these are Portuguese-speaking pastors in the Boston region. It is one of the largest Portuguese-speaking communities in the United States, with nearly two hundred thousand Brazilians living in this region of the country. We are sharing phase two. The churches are preparing to do the surveys and have the profiles of the churches and this week the gifts workshop will begin. We are doing both face-to-face and virtual training. I ask you to please pray for this work. Thank God, we already have the Love Serves material in another language, having it in Portuguese. I count on your prayers so that God will enable me to do this work, God bless you".

Nidio Tejada: "I am very happy with Peter's recovery, and I thank my brothers who make up this team. One of the pastors of the Hispanic group, Pastor Sergio Garza, shared in one of the meetings how his church has been waking up in relation to work with the community; they discovered the need for a family with a young woman who had suffered a thrombosis. The pastor testified how members of this church helped this young woman, bathed her, took care of her, the men repaired some problems that the house had with the drainage and how they ministered emotionally and spiritually to the members of this family. They identified a house with floor problems and the men of the congregation got together to go repair this floor. This is a sign that the vision is bearing fruit, as they are opening their eyes and seeing the needs in the community. It is as we say: 'the Church is the hope of the community'. This is how the Lord is working in the midst of Hispanic pastors."

The president thanked God for having worked on the health of Peter and his family, "we have prayed a lot for you, and we are very happy to hear from you".

8. FREE TIME

Coach Nathanael Duval shared with us about his experiences with AVI.

"In the municipality of Neiba, there is the pastor Yasiris Vásquez; who managed to open a radio program in the midst of the pandemic that allowed her to maintain her ministry with children, not only children from her community, but also with other

children from other communities as well. From the program she focused on issues of values and family. In a census she made, she was able to identify twenty-two children with special needs; of which, some were not included in the programs of the Ministry of Education. Another of the initiatives of this pastor is to collaborate with a group of children who do not have registered by their parents and who to date do not have a birth certificate, with the aggravating circumstance that their parents do not have a birth certificate either. They are currently finishing the process with three of those children, so very soon these children will have their birth certificates. The influence of this church has been such that the police have requested their collaboration so that the pastor engages in talks on child abuse in various communities in Neiba."

José Brito: "The information we have from Guatemala is that out of the fifteen churches that we visited on the last trip, they have reported twenty-two ministries, one hundred and twenty-two new believers and thirty-six baptisms. These churches are working on food distribution, family counseling, etc. We have recruited forty new churches. Of those churches, thirty-one participated in the Holistic Vision workshop that was shared last June and the vast majority of them, except for one network, took the spiritual gifts workshop."

"One of the trained pastors is serving as a facilitator for the gifts workshop. Something that caught our attention was the fact that some pastors drove twelve hours to get to the workshop and twelve hours to return. The enthusiasm of those brothers greatly surprised us. We had suggested waiting for us to open a network in their city, to which they replied that they did not want to miss the opportunity to do so now. They travel to the capital for their networking meetings, a journey that takes about seven hours. We ask you to keep praying for brother Eddy de León and Samuel España (a local pastor who is carrying out advisory work in Guatemala)".

The president thanks God for AVI. "These testimonies are a demonstration of what God is doing".

Daniel Ramírez: "Let me refer to that testimony that Nathanael shared, where the police are asking him to get involved with them to go to a sector to help. I say, 'glory to God', it does not matter that many churches do not understand this vision, whoever did not take advantage of it, simply did not take advantage of it. It is enough that there are a few experiences like these that speak of the change that God is doing in churches and communities. I praise the Lord for these testimonies, and I encourage you to continue forward, because that seed is what the Lord wants to be planted and spread.

The president thanked Daniel Ramírez for his words, and added: "I feel that this, more than an assembly, has been very edifying. I feel like those 'small trees'" when

fresh water reaches them. In these days I have had many trials, but this time has strengthened me.

The president congratulated the entire AAVI team for their dedication and responsible work. "We must pray that the work that is being done will continue to be extended and that the Lord will continue to extend this work."

Laura Felipe: "After listening to our brother Daniel Ramírez, I was motivated to participate. Every year is different; we, from the inside, who are always working with papers, invoices, etc. we constantly ask Jochi, Daniel and Hansel 'How did it go?' And then we get the testimonials, but it's very different when the coaches come. Nidio, for example, gives us abundant details of his experiences, Raphael too. It is an enormous joy to be able to see, as Daniel said, that the Lord is glorified. He knows the land where the seed falls and knows the percentage of fruit it will bear. This year Nidio invited me to participate in some workshops; Nidio is very creative, and I have been praying for a long time to participate in a different way; not only in AVI, but as a believer. So, as God has given me the gifts to be organized and I'm good with numbers -Nidio didn't know that- Hansel and Nidio came up with a pilot project to deliver to the pastors, about finances; thinking of the pastoral family that often finds itself in poverty and economic difficulty. My testimony is that I was surprised, moved, overwhelmed and I could see behind those little screens what those pastors were receiving; They were immediately thinking, 'How do I take this and pass it on to the church and to those who come to us as pastors for advice?'

The delivery was thinking of them, but they immediately thought of their leaders and their community. That gave me great pleasure and encouraged me more every day. When we go to the Vision workshop, that is the first thing that is done: make an inventory of needs; and begin to look outside. So, seeing that this is becoming stronger changes the DNA, the pastor's way of thinking and that the least he receives is to give it, which is what the Lord taught us ".

Martin Newby: "There is a lot that has been said today and this is a day to celebrate. All the testimonies, the results of salvation, have been very good; and we have had two very difficult years in the United States and in the Dominican Republic. What they do in the Dominican Republic works in good times and bad: the church being the church and reaching the little ones. I want to encourage all of you to celebrate the report we have heard and the expectations that the new year will bring; And I want to keep talking about discipleship, I know it's a priority, but it's an even higher priority than we think, because we're working with pastors and mentoring each one of them; but the approach of making disciples who make disciples in the church and the impact that it can have would be exponential. I want to motivate them to make disciples who make disciples because they will be the future leaders and pastors, the mayors and governors and the leaders of the country; and they will be leaders of our

churches and communities; and those are those who have been discipled. It is a great day to celebrate, I wish I had been there with you. These last two years out of the last thirty-eight years, we've longed to be there. Thank you very much for the service you do. Thank you very much.

The president thanked everyone for their participation and asked Martin Newby to close in prayer.

The president closed the work of the Assembly.

ANNUAL REPORT 2021 - 2022



ASOCIACION AGUAS VIVIENTES INC. REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR THE PERIOD 20 21-2022 SEPTEMBER 9, 2022.

We are moved by the vision of seeing Empowered Churches influencing the transformation of their communities, which inspires us to carry out actions whose mission is to accompany, equip and enable the local churches, so that they promote the experience of the Kingdom' value in all strata of our society.

We are infinitely grateful to our God for the great opportunity He has given us as a team to be an active part in the establishment of His kingdom at this time. Being aware that we have much to do, and as the apostle Paul says in Philippians 3:14: I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.

We started the year with a lot of uncertainty, we could not guarantee that we would comply with the entire work plan. Faced with this scenario, we embrace the challenge that the Word of God gives us. I press on toward the goal. God has been faithful in keeping His promises to us. He gave us a wonderful day's work in this fiscal year. Below, we share the details of the activities executed during the year.

In the first semester a sample of 258 churches was taken from a universe of 796, and in the second semester, the number of churches that made up the sample is 266 from a universe of 877.

With the qualification of the pastors who entered our accompaniment program in the second half of last fiscal year and participated in the Vision Integral workshops, the sample was increased by 81 in relation to the first semester, rising from 796 to 877.

FIRST SEMESTER

In the first semester we dedicated ourselves to working on discipleship, with the goal of increasing the number of churches that use discipleship as a tool for growth.

SECOND SEMESTER

The second semester started with great challenges, in those days our country faced a second wave of infections caused by Covid 19, affecting a large part of our staff, just so you have an idea, the first week of our return from Christmas break, for half of the week I was the only person in the office because the others were affected by Covid and one on maternity leave.

We give infinite thanks to God who in his mercy to us, provided a quick recovery to all those affected, which allowed us to assume the tasks programmed in our plan.

Growth in attendance at the main service. The 87.6% of churches showed growth in attendance at primary worship service; of these, 62% grew by 10%, while 23% of churches surveyed grew above 20% in attendance at their main worship service. 10% of the churches surveyed grew by 30% between January and June 2022 and 1% achieved a growth over 50%.

New Believers. 91.4% of churches gained new believers.

Baptized New Believers. The 52.6% reported having baptized new believers. The total number of believers baptized in the second semester was 1,010 believers.

Astray. The number of those who turned their back on the Lord in the semester was 141.

Ministries of services. This is the same number I reported in the first semester, 269 ministries. This is an annual data.

Networks and Churches in Natural Church Development. In the semester our regional coaches opened 17 new networks with a total of 121 churches participating in them.

In August 2021, a reinforcement workshop was held for the leaders of the churches of the regional coaches who are involved in one-on-one discipleship, we call this activity "jump", that is, an impulse to reactivate those who may be lagging. 38 leaders participated and 12 pastors were added.

The second semester began with the strategy of expanding the vision of discipleship by holding regional conferences. The idea was to engage as many pastors as possible in a city or region and have them bring their key leaders of their congregations. The experiment was successful, and we managed to train, in the spring of 2022, 202 pastors and 500 leaders, that is, 702 people were added to the vision of discipleship.

We designed follow-up networks made up of the pastors and leaders who participated in the regional conferences. 521 people are already participating in networks guided by AAVI's Regional Coaches. The reports show how those who joined are getting excited every day about the mission and vision of making disciples. We pray and trust the Lord, so that this may generate a before and after, in the life of the church in the Dominican Republic.

We are pleased to share that this time the delivery was prepared and masterfully delivered by our Financial Manager Laura Felipe. Feedback from many of the participants suggests that the delivery has had a major impact on the lives of the couples who have participated.

GUATEMALA

In Guatemala, networks have remained active, despite the complications of the pandemic. Brother Samuel España continues to collaborate in support of the work of our coach Eddy De León. In the first half of the year there were two follow-up trips, in July and November 2021. In September, the first Family Counseling module was delivered. In both, September and November, several pastors were interviewed, 23 in total, to learn about the results of the trainings on the main indicators of the program. The answers are shown in the following table.

So far, despite the slowness of the process, we can say that the difficulties have been resolved. Thank God a few months ago we got the certification of the DGII. In which they issued a certification that will serve us for the exemption of taxes, to them transfer the title to AVI name.

GRIP

We thank God for providing an ally like the GRIP. Their contributions are a great complement to the program that The Lord makes among the pastors and leaders we coach.

The Psychotherapeutic Reflection and Intervention Group (GRIP) continues with its hard work providing services through a team of professionals committed to help the well-being of society.

We are still concerned with the reality of **violence in the family**: as is known, violence in the family is determined by several factors, among them the exposure that children have to acts of conjugal and gender violence within the home, as well as the exposure of women at an early age to violent acts or treatment, generating impact not only in the aspect of their relationships, but also in the cognitive, emotional and physical development included (Maria Isabel Santana, El país 2022).

Abuse and pregnancies in adolescents: Similarly, the general report of the Enhogar-MICS 2019 of the National Statistics Office (ONE) and UNICEF confirm that the high rates of pregnancies in young people and adolescents remain unchanged in the country, being worse in rural areas. 20.4% of young women (20-24 years old), had a child before the age of 18; and in the ethereal group of those under 15, 32% joined a man before the same age (Odalis Mejía, El País, 2022)

Suicides: The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) warned in its most relevant annual (2021) and global publication that the effects of COVID-19 on the mental health and well-being of children and young people could last for many years.

The latest available estimates suggest that 15 percent of children and adolescents aged 10 to 19 in Latin America and the Caribbean (about 16 million) live with a diagnosed mental disorder.

Also, in the case of the Dominican Republic, according to data from the Ministry of Health (MSP) of 2018, suicide is the third cause of death in adolescents aged 14 to 18 years, only surpassed by traffic accidents and homicides (October 2021).

The dependence of our adolescents and young people on technological activities (at the level of clinical consultation in different mental health spaces, the increase in adolescents with difficulty in "detaching" from video games and use of electronic equipment has been confirmed). Although these situations were already present in our country, without a doubt the occurrence of the pandemic has generated as part of its effects the conditions for the growth and intensification of these evils.

Research and studies carried out both locally and, in the region, show that children and the family in general face conditions that increasingly deteriorate the levels of mental and therefore physical health, compromising the generation of healthy families that can live and manage the type of life that God has designed for human beings.

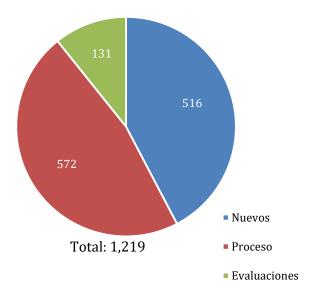
Our efforts are being invested in contributing to the confrontation of these evils and that the people trapped in them can find the resources to have truly healthy lives in an integral way. Our conviction is that God has designed true life for individuals and families, and our commitment is to be Instruments of Him so that this just life becomes a reality in the midst of a society guided by injustice.

Interventions carried out. This year we carried out a new training in La Vega to train a group of 12 people who started the project of prevention of Pregnancies and Marriages (unions) in Adolescents (PEMEA), detained for two years due to the pandemic, which will be developed for two years with a group of 24 adolescents (between 12 and 16 years old) from communities surrounding the church that develops it. We will be accompanying you during that time.

We also carry out various interventions through workshops and talks with churches, educational and commercial institutions around the requested topics. Among these: loss management, depression and anxiety, technological addiction, adolescent sexuality, relationships in the company and conflict management, family violence, career choice, communication, care for caregivers and others of this nature. Regarding pastoral workshops in Family Counseling, we continue to support AVI. with the three family counseling modules. Another important contribution of the GRIP. It has been your support training two of our regional coaches, who are already delivering these trainings.

Therapeutic and Diagnostic Services. This year 2021-2022, one thousand two hundred and nineteen cases received attention. Of these, 516 were new patients, patients who continue with their processes 572 and 131 with demand for evaluations in various areas.

According to the percentage distribution, the greatest demands were in the areas of personal growth (refers to situations that the patient identifies as obstructive in his life and that prevent him from growing) 25%, Marital situations, 18%, Other cases 11% (includes, issues of anxiety, self-control, disciplines, fears, etc.) and Family conflicts, Depression and Behavioral, 7% of the total cases.

CONCLUSION

We have shared many statistics of what by the grace of God the Lord allow us to develop during the fiscal year, I would like to conclude this report by sharing what is not seen in the statistics, I mean the testimonies of transformation that produce a strong motivation to continue doing what we do.

I introduce you to a leader of one of the churches that have been accompanied for several years now. The church to which we refer identified that the vast majority of adults in the community could not read or write and set out to start a literacy program. Kelvin Rosario, restless young man, leader of that church was the one who led this initiative. After living the experience successfully, the idea of starting a school for the whole community was born. Thus, they extended the ministry by starting a school for the children of *Jalonga*. The need was pressing, the resources scarce, but the will of the church was firm.

Faced with the reality of not having the resources to develop a school that can provide a quality service, diligences were made with the Ministry of Education, so that they assumed the project; But this was not an easy task. Despite having the support of authorities such as the senator of the province, the Ministry of Education did not allow schools to open in *bateyes*, and this community was a *batey*, but the church prayed and pushed this project until it was finally a reality, setting the precedent of the first *batey* with a public high school in the entire Dominican Republic.

This was not an average high school; it became a model in the educational district to which it belongs. Kelvin Rosario was the founding, director. Both he and the school received multiple recognitions from the Ministry of Education.

For 5 years, Kelvin is now a pastor in Hato Mayor, and has been an instrument of God in the process of transforming the church he pastors. They have several ministries that fulfill an important work among the neediest of that place and have a school, a nursery and the membership has tripled after their arrival.

We praise God to see that churches are empowering themselves in their communities, positively influencing the work of the people, and the most relevant thing is that lives are transformed by the power of the gospel, through the person of Christ.
